This will mean much longer wait times for eBooks from popular authors, limiting access for everyone, but especially for our customers with print or visual disabilities and those who cannot afford to buy their own eBooks.

Richmond Public Library is joining the Canadian Urban Libraries Council (CULC), Urban Libraries Council (ULC), the American Library Association (ALA) and other public libraries to formally and loudly oppose MacMillan's policy change.
